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Program Participation Snapshot: Academic Year 2019-2020 and Five Year Enrollment Trends

College Now, a *free* college transition and dual enrollment program, is a major partnership between CUNY and NYCDOE, enlisting 19 colleges and over 480 NYC public high schools in its mission to help students successfully transition to college. The program provides college credit courses aligned with first-year study at CUNY, pre-college courses that increase students' academic readiness for college without a need for remediation, college and career awareness courses and activities, full-day summer programs, and access to CUNY campus facilities and events. In 2019-2020¹, College Now had 33,904 enrollments in courses and served 23,526 students.

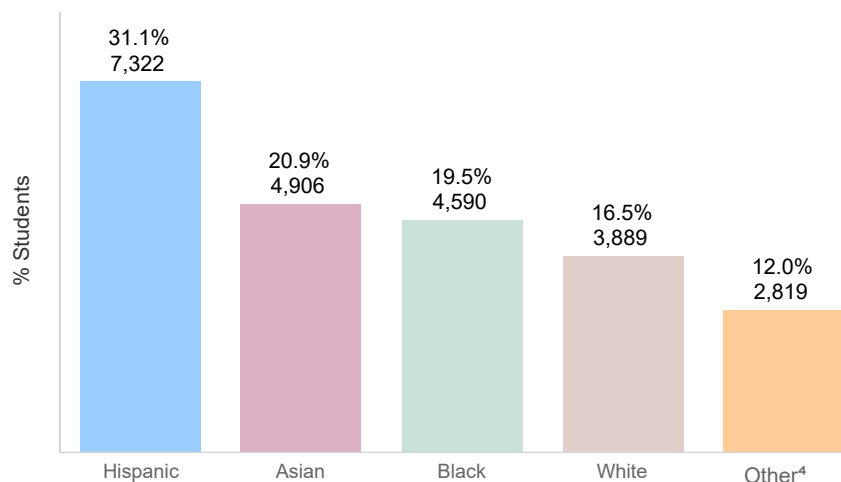
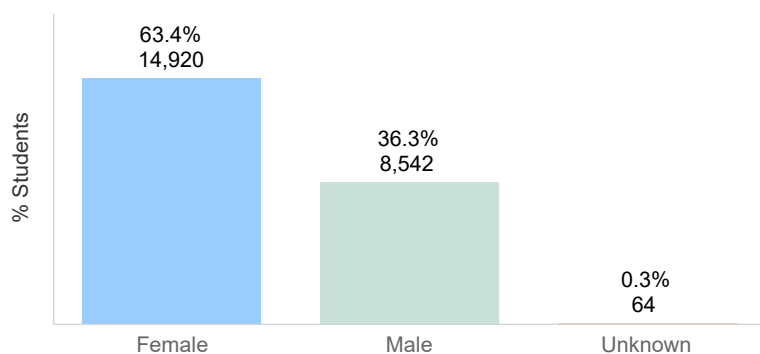

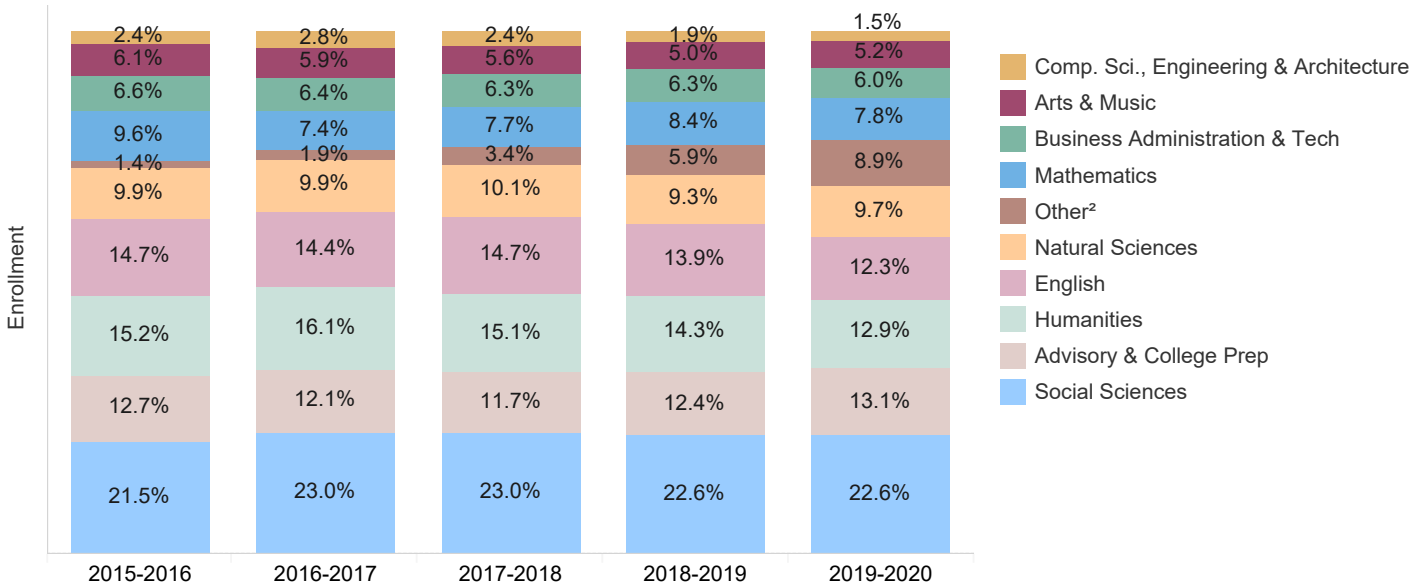

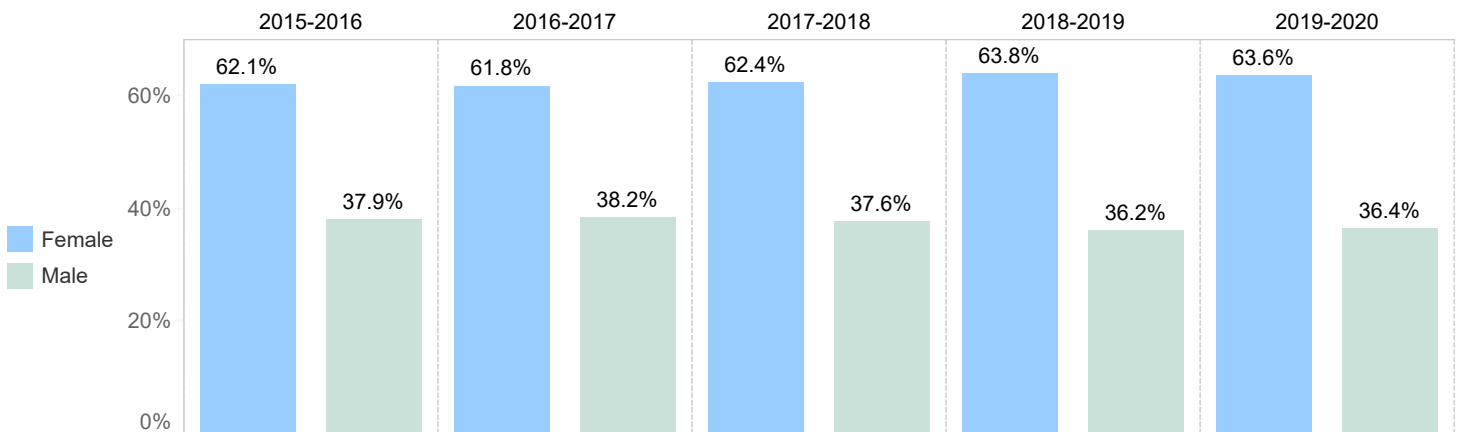

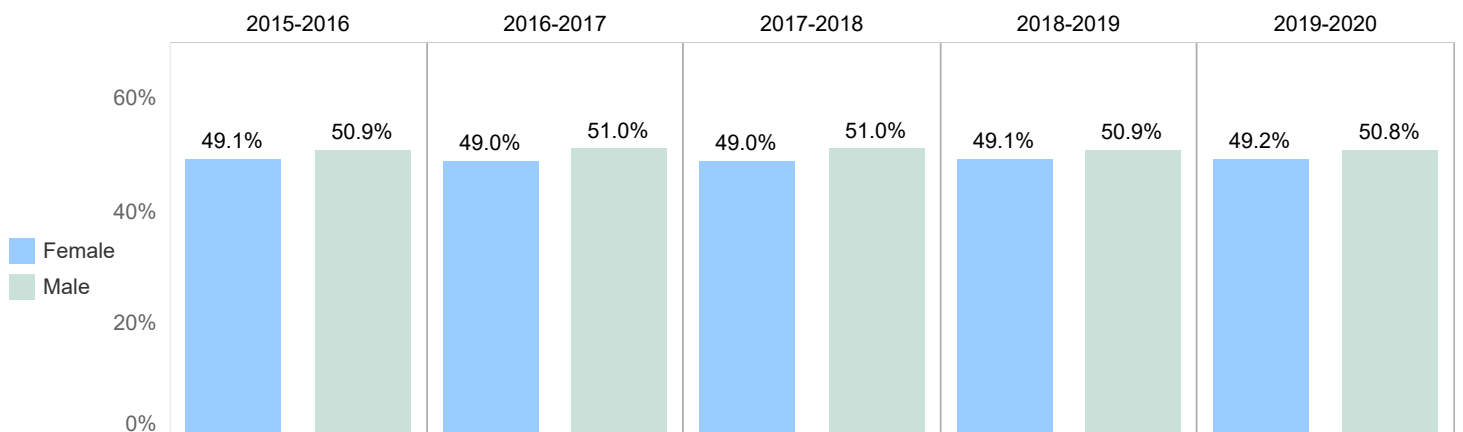

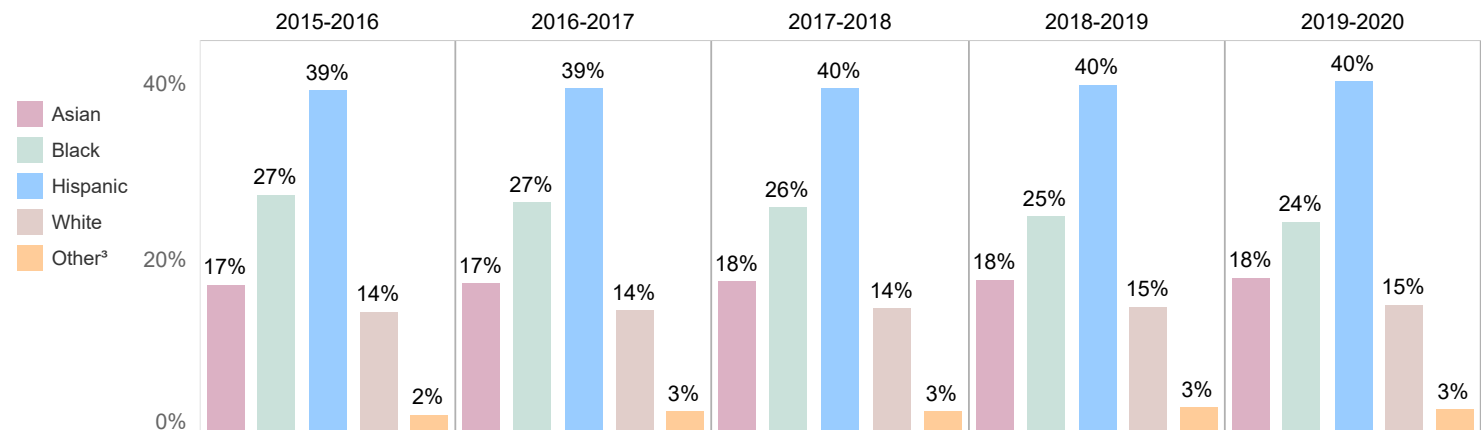

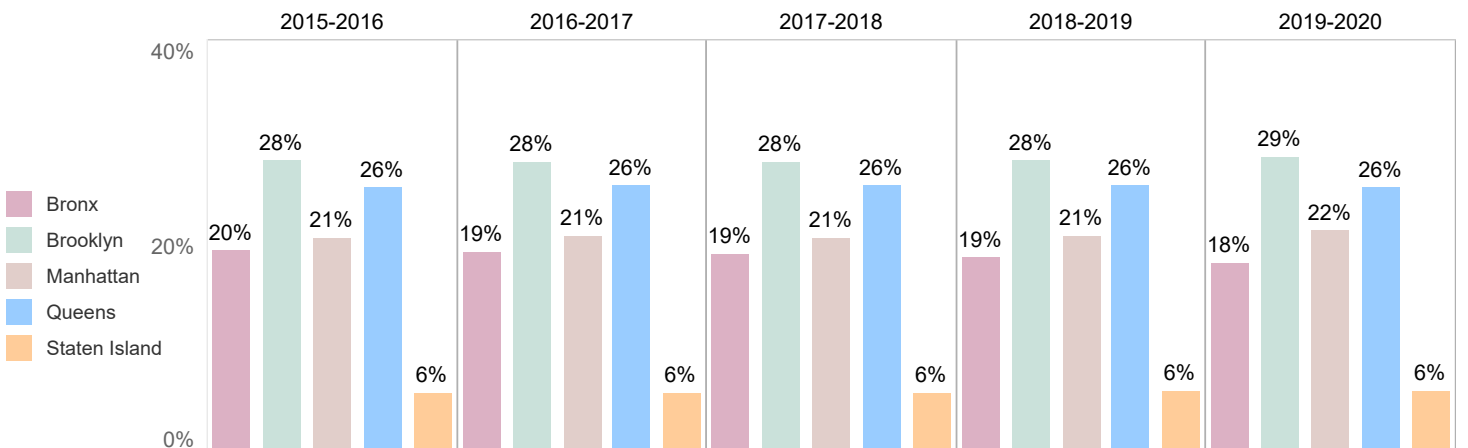

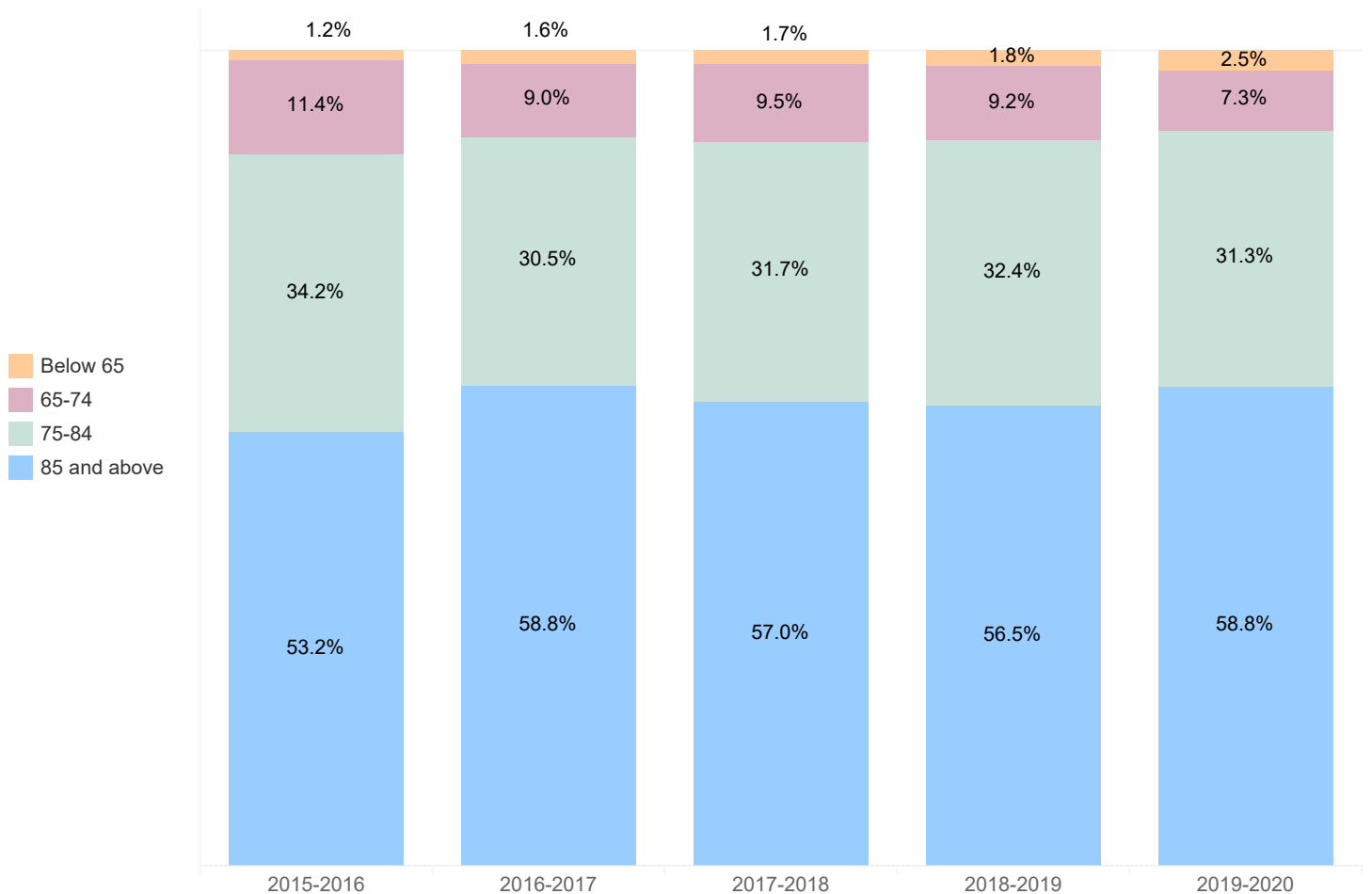

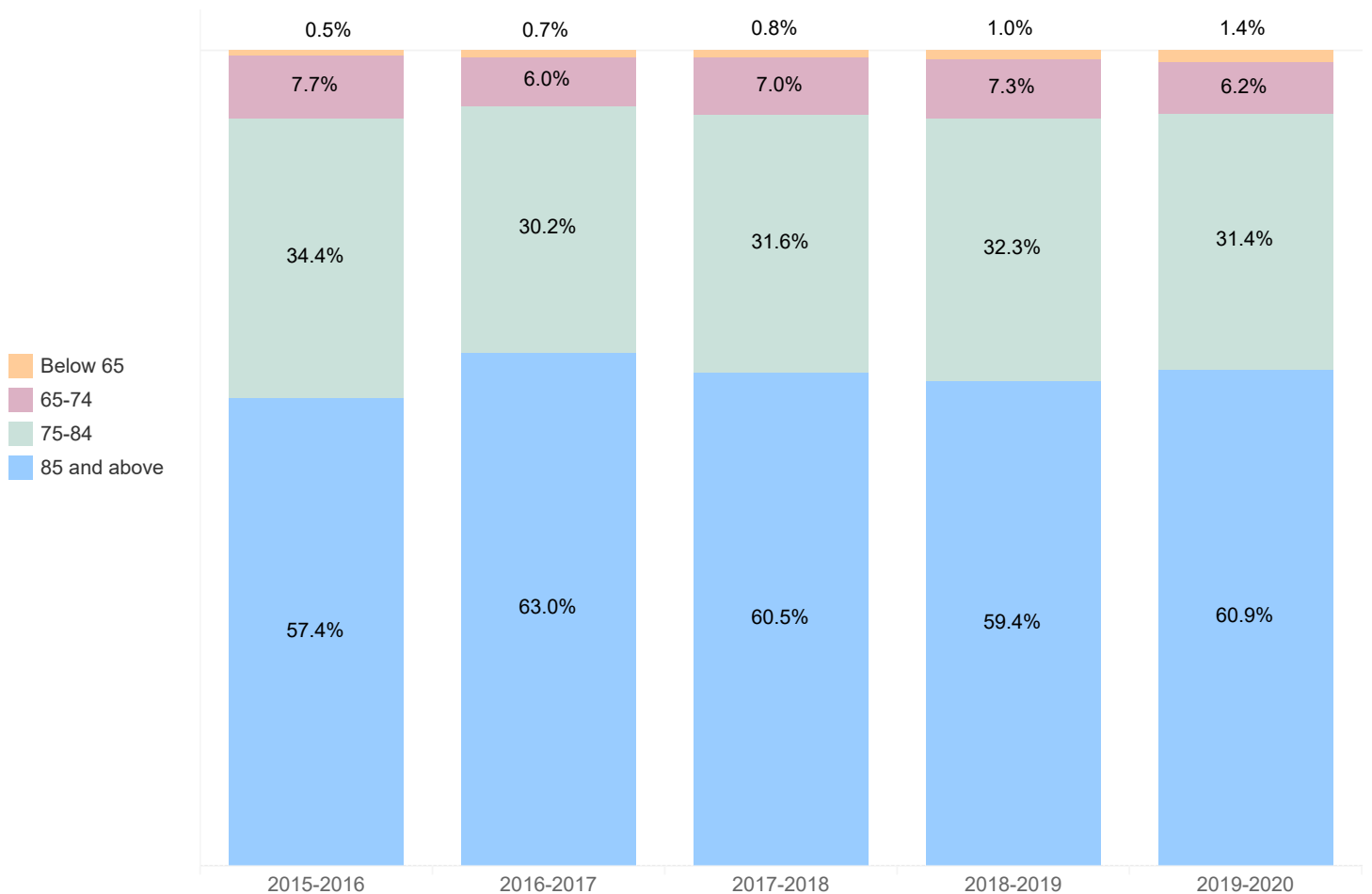
